 - Health and wellbeing
 - Sustainable energy and water
 - Sustainable food
 - Sustainable and ethical procurement
 - Circular economy (including responsible waste management)

- To map sustainability across the Knowledge Quarter, including alignment with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.
- To host an event recognising sustainability achievements in the Knowledge Quarter and successful network collaborations.

- To report progress to KQ Liverpool, and support KQ Liverpool's transformative vision for the area.
